On September 29, 2002, Doug Kalinowski was appointed Director of the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA). In that role, he oversees the MIOSHA program, which is responsible for enforcing workplace safety and health standards and providing consultation, education and training, and outreach services.

From February 1997 to October 2002, Kalinowski served as Deputy Director, with responsibilities for all enforcement programs.

According to Kalinowski, the MIOSHA program is committed to “*Make a Difference*” in reducing fatalities, injuries and illnesses and ensuring a safe and healthy workplace for all employees.

In conjunction with his responsibilities as Director of MIOSHA, Kalinowski serves in a leadership role with the Occupational Safety and Health State Plan Association (OSHSPA), a national organization representing 26 state-run worker safety and health programs.

Kalinowski obtained his undergraduate degree in 1978, and an M.S. in Industrial Hygiene in 1979, both from the University of Michigan.
