PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Just as we were finalizing plans in September, Michigan had yet another COVID spike, and it seemed ridiculous for an organization of health and safety professionals gather together in one room for an all-day event. The former "Best Paper" award has officially been renamed the Jim D'Arcy JOEH Original Article Award.

The second piece of big news is that MIHS has endowed a second college scholarship in honor of Bill Cleary. The scholarship that has been in place for years is for a student in the graduate

The text of the award reads: In awarding the Michigan Industrial Hygiene Society Bill Cleary Memorial Scholarship, preference is given to Michigan residents enrolled in an occupational health and safety-based curriculum, at a Michigan college or university. We wanted this scholarship to be available to a broader population of students.

Professional


Engineers may also receive certification maintenance points, though they must check with their local professional engineering organization. A block of rooms has been reserved at the Kellogg Center.
