MIHS PRESENTS BEST PAPER AWARD AT 2016 AIHCE

In keeping with a long-standing tradition, the MIHS Best Paper award was presented at the AlHce in Baltimore, Maryland. Ms. Cynthia Ostrowski, AlHA Vice President (and MIHS member/Past President/former Board Member) presented the award at the Mark of Excellence Breakfast on May 25, 2016. This year's award recipients were Drs. T. Renée Anthony and Kimberly R. Anderson. Their award-winning paper was entitled *An Empirical Model of Human Aspiration in Low-Velocity Air Using CFD Investigations*.

The MIHS Best Paper Award was established by MIHS in 1957 as recognition of outstanding publication in the American Industrial Hygiene Association Journal. In 1989, the MIHS Board of Directors voted to also recognize the authors of the best paper in applied industrial hygiene from the Ap-

plied Occupational and Environmental Hygiene Journal. Both journals combined in 2004 to form the current Journal of Occupational and Environmental Hygiene. MIHS continues to present a best paper award each year to the authors of the outstanding article selected from this journal.

AIHA ANNOUNCES NEW CEO

On August 16, 2016, the American Industrial Hygiene Association® (AIHA) announced that its board of directors has appointed Lawrence "Larry" D. Sloan, CAE as the new CEO, effective October 17, 2016 to lead the largest national association dedicated to protecting worker health.

Sloan, currently President/CEO of the Society of Chemical Manufacturers and Affiliates (SOCMA), the leading trade association serving the specialty chemical sector, is a seasoned association professional known for his track record in passing national legislation and regulations, building coalitions with other trade groups, and introducing state-of-the-art products, services, and tools to benefit SOCMA members.

Mr. Sloan served as President of the Adhesive and Sealant Council. He began his career as a chemical engineer at Air Products and later worked for Nalco Chemical Company in marketing, manufacturing and sales capacities.

Mr. Sloan earned a BS in Chemical Engineering from the University of Pennsylvania and an MBA from the Kellogg

Graduate School of Management at Northwestern University. He holds a Certified Association Executive (CAE) designation through the American Society of Association Executives.

Nancy Green, CAE, who was appointed AIHA's Interim Executive Director upon the resignation of AIHA's Executive Director of 7 years, Peter O'Neil, in February 2016,

will serve as Deputy Executive Director upon Larry Sloan's arrival.
