AIHA hosts local section websites free of charge, but with limited functionality. Some of the local sections are using a website format called Wild Apricot, which may be the way to go. We have spoken with the Georgia local section about their experience using this platform. As always, we would welcome any input from the membership. If anyone has any expertise in website development, in general, or the Wild Apricot format, in particular, we would love to hear from you. A couple of the improvements we would like to make to our current site are the "back of house" things like ease of maintaining the membership list, ease of messaging the membership, and ease of tracking payment.

The public-facing part of the website looks great. We just need to make it function like it's 2021 rather than 1999.

While our Fall Conference will (hopefully) be a gathering of people in one room, some upcoming events will be virtual. IN MEMORIUM: JIM D'ARCY 1949-2021

MIHS Past President, and all-around great guy, Jim D'Arcy, passed away on June 26th. He was a beloved husband and father who positively touched and generously helped all the members of his extended family. Among his many talents and achievements. Jim also was a long time and active member of MIHS. Jim served on the MIHS board and was MIHS President multiple times each. Jim made numerous

presentations at meetings and conferences, and even earlier this year, lead the MIHS Best Paper selection process one last time. If you had the opportunity to meet Jim and get to know him, you soon understood what a wealth of knowledge, expertise and graciousness he brought to the discussion.

Jim grew up in Almont and then on a farm in Waldenburg, Michigan. While learning farming life he also got into many legendary antics with his brothers Donald and Robert (involving pulleys, ladders, vehicles, minor explosives, etc.). After dropping out of high school, he became a self-studied certified auto mechanic, working on cars full-time and helping friends with muscle cars. In fact, his first date with Kris his wife of nearly 52 years, was at a stock car race in Mount Clemens. They were married September 13, 1969.

Jim served in the Air Force after being drafted, and then attended college on the G.I. Bill. He received bachelor's and master's degrees in chemistry from Oakland University. After graduating, Jim began working at the General Motors Technical Center in Warren. In 1974, Jim and Kris's daughter Hannah was born, and then in 1979, son Ethan was born. Jim worked as a research scientist in toxicology for nearly twenty years before going back to

school to attain a PhD in Environmental and Industrial Health from the University Michigan in 1997.

Jim was dedicated to protecting workers from occupational health hazards; pioneering the process of mapping aerosol concentrations at machining operations and advancing methods to evaluate and control the hazards posed by mycobacteria and asbestos. He also attended UAW contract negotiations and made many contributions to ensure that appropriate worker safety measures were implemented. His career achievements received special recognition as he was awarded the status of GM Technical Fellow from GM Research and Development leadership.

Jim also had many interests outside of work, including maintaining antique John Deere tractors (eventually owning two); using them to grow a large garden; teaching chemistry at a community college; pursuing a private pilot's license; storm spotting as a trained Sky Warn volunteer; and in his spare time, chairing the Arcadia Township planning commission. And of course, Jim developed and used numerous spreadsheets to track data regarding bird sightings, ambient temperatures, and ice formations on the lake in view of his home.

Yes, Jim was a gentleman of many interests and incredibly wide and varied knowledge and he is certainly missed by those who had an opportunity to know him.



The Michigan Industrial Hygiene Society Best Paper Award was established by MIHS in 1957 for recognition of an outstanding publication in the American Industrial Hygiene Association Journal. In 1989, the MIHS board of directors voted to also recognize the authors of the best paper in applied industrial hygiene from the Applied Occupational and Environmental Hygiene Journal. In 2004 both journals were combined to form the current Journal of Occupational and Environmental Hygiene (JOEH). MIHS continues to present a Best Paper Award each year. This year's recipients are Lee Ann Greenawald. Kent C. Hofacre. and Edward M. Fisher for Fentanyl and Carfentanil Permeation through Commercial Disposable Gloves.


